T ASD Grant Recipients

Education is one of the Junior League of Texarkana's focus areas; therefore, through Teacher Take Wing, they provide "mini-grants" (up to \$500.00) to help assist teachers in progressive teaching programs for their primary and secondary students. Students gain access to new programs that excite and create life long learners. Since 1986, the Junior League of Texarkana has donated an estimated \$150,000 to local educators through the Teacher Take Wing program.

ART GRANTS:

Art teacher, Georgia Hubnik, received the Arkansas Arts Council AIE Mini-Residency Grant of \$1,000 for Trice Elementary. The mini-residency grant will allow local artist, Susan Sanders, the opportunity to work with students in creating a mural within the halls of Trice Elementary. Mrs. Hubnik was also awarded a \$500 mini-grant from Wal-Mart to support additional art projects!

SCIENCE GRANTS:

The Arkansas Science & Technology Authority awarded three \$500 mini-grants to purchase consumables or standard-based science kits for College Hill Middle School. The science kits are to be used for hands on science experiences in the classrooms of Ms. Melissa Estes, Ms. Julie Carver and Ms. Tami Canterbury.
